- A little more structure.
- Encourage everyone to talk, because it wound up being the same group of about half of us contributing to the discussion and everyone else just sat there. Also, perhaps force everyone to know names or say their names or something to create more of a community within the class.
- More structure in terms of topics: for example, could group music, then tv/video entertainment, then photography, etc., and discuss and read about each topic for each meeting.
