- (a) Intuitively, when would the airline increase it's price? When would the airline decrease it's price? Explain why.
- (b) Instead of yield management, the airline could simply use a fixed price. When will there be little loss from using a fixed price? That is, for what kind of flights will the lost profit be small?
- 4. [25] You are bidding for a used car at an auction.
- (a) A car is likely to have private—value and common—value components: provide an example of each.
- (b) Explain how the common value components can lead to a winner's curse.
